Thank you for attending the parent consultations held on Friday 24th October, we believe the day allowed you to have quality time with your child's teacher. Since the start of term, we have held a number of assemblies for you to come along to and enjoy seeing your children take part in, they really work hard collaborating with each other and performing so please do keep coming along as we want to celebrate and showcase what they do.

Each term our curriculum incorporates experiences and opportunities for the children to enhance their learning so trips, visits, visitors in school, matter a great deal. The visits are planned in advance and aligned to the topics that the children work on, in school. We want the children to enjoy their learning and get the very best out of what we offer.
