English

During the Summer term, children will be writing for a range of purposes. We will be focusing on two texts.

Autumn 1 – The Mousehole Cat

The dramatic and moving Cornish tale of Mowzer, the cat, and Tom, the old Fisherman, who brave the fury of the Great Storm Cat to try and save their village.

Autumn 2 – Arthur and the Golden Rope

Buried amongst the treasures in Professor Brownstone's vault, lies a humble collection of books. Filled with legendary stories from his ancestors, they tell of fearless fighters and unlikely heroes. Arthur journeys to the land of the Vikings to a place filled with magical objects and powerful gods.

Reading

Children will be fosuing on a variety of texts such as themed fiction, nonfiction and poetry texts with questions to support the development of comprehension in-line with the national curriculum's reading domains. Please encourage when possible your children to login to Bug Club to access a wide variety of books, grammar and spelling games and also record any home reading in your child's planner.

<u>Maths</u>

We will be continuing to use the 'mastery maths' approach at Salisbury called 'Power Maths', that is designed to enable children to acquire a deep, long-term, secure and adaptable understanding of mathematics. In the Autumn term, we will be covering place value, addition and subtraction,

Spelling

Design Technology:

Our Art topic this half-term is Viking art. Children will take part in exploring the key elements and features of Viking art. They will do this through a range of artist approaches such as using pastels, painting and sketching.

Later on in the term, Year 4 will be focusing on dance and will be performing a range of traditional Indian dances.
